*These times are approximate and may not represent your horse's exact schedule. Discuss your horse's specific needs with VLAC for possible alterations to the schedule (i.e. travel to specific regions, changes in disease prevalence year-to-year, etc.). Each subsequent appointment is approximately 2 weeks after the previous one.

*If your horse has not received a specific vaccine before they will be required to do an initial series which typically requires 2-3 vaccinations 3-4 weeks apart to build up adequate immunity.

Deworming:

VLAC-EH recommends performing a FEC once or twice a year. Based on the results, we will recommend a specific deworming plan. The goal is *not* to obtain FECs of zero but to *reduce* the number of parasites.
